3) continued. - 1 suggest the technological taxes be facilitated via software of the relevant operating systems such as windows via Microsoft & other relevant software, i-phone, to companies. - That is so as to preserve communications infrastructure such as cell-phone towers to transmitters, radio transmitters & their associated infrastructure & Staff. Generally technological items are for "the reasonably well-of people" of the population. The taxes can also be used to help education aspects for the population as a whole (not just kids). - Wrt taxing hair. Those with a lot of hair, including the most obvious hair of the head + face could be taxed through the usual hair salons + barber shops. Private hair cutting could be made illegal. It would become obvious those avoiding paying hair taxes. It could include other bodily hair but that may be difficult to enforce/police. - With taxing power poles this tax is especially for those properties which have wooden power poles on their property. Councils would obviously (along with NZTA NZTransport Andhority/Agency) pay the bulk. He could also likely extend to light poles/posts.
