The attached paper is my submission on the future of taxation in New Zealand and argues for a complete change in the basis of taxation, suitable for the technological realities of the 21st century.

Our current tax system is unwieldy and has been patched many times, resulting in complexity and compliance costs at very high levels.

Much of it has been designed with the assistance of tax experts who have a vested interest in producing complexity and loop-holes.

This paper argues for simplification, low compliance costs and broadening the tax base to take in inefficient activities adding costs to the producing economy, while enabling us to phase out old and inefficient forms of taxation.

It will take some time to show its full benefits, but if the design work is commenced this year it should be possible to pass legislation following the next election and commence the reform shortly thereafter.
